She would jot down new names and prayer requests as they came to her, and then she'd tuck the cards into her Bible, her purse or even the cushions of her favorite chair. If she had a free minute, she was praying.

"I think it's honest to say she was never bored because of her prayer life," said her grandson, Gilbert C. Hanke, top executive of the Commission on United Methodist Men.

Hanke said after his grandmother's death, his parents helped clear out the family's home and found more than a hundred of her prayer cards scattered around in books, drawers and other places.

"It was like seeds that she planted," Hanke said. "I don't have much from Grandma, but I do have this memory. Every time I see an index card, that's what I think of."

There are many ways we might pray for our church and one another. Many are participants in the Prayer Chain so they can pray for people's health needs. You could put a timer on your phone to remind you to pray for your church each day. I love how we pray together each Sunday during Joys and Concerns.

Starting Sunday, May 8th we will be starting a new sermon series on <u>The Lord's Prayer</u> by Adam Hamilton. For the next six weeks we will be learning how to pray as Jesus taught his disciples to pray. I am looking forward to God's encouragement and strengthening of our prayer lives.

We will be starting a new thing each month in Dent and Vergas. I'm calling it a Breakfast Club. We'll see if it works. But I'm thinking, "You gotta eat right?"

Bring your appetite and a friend. I'm looking forward to fellowshipping together.







We had a wonderful experience with VBS last year! The kids were great and the evenings flew by. We hope we to offer VBS again August 1st through the







Next Book Club meeting Tues, May 3rd at the Loon's Nest.

Backyard Song Bird Lovers - Some info on the Bird Flu ~ Is it Safe to Feed Wild Birds Right Now?

There is no official recommendation to take down feeders unless you also keep domestic poultry, according to the National Wildlife Disease Program.



"The Cornell Lab of Ornithology and United States Department of Agriculture have both stated that <u>bird feeding is safe</u>. Out of an abundance of caution, some agencies initially suggested taking feeders down, but these guidelines have been scaled back. Currently, there are not any restrictions in place on bird feeders."

If you raise poultry and live in an area where avian influenza is being reported, you could consider removing bird feeders in the short term. "Past outbreaks of avian flu have generally waned by early summer,".

The Illinois Department of Natural Resources says hummingbird feeders and oriole feeders do not need to be removed.

Waterfowl including ducks, geese, and swans, are the main group impacted. It can be fatal in these species. Other birds including raptors like hawks and eagles, as well as shorebirds and gulls have also tested positive for HPAI H5N1 during this outbreak. Research has shown songbirds are less likely to contract bird flu and are less likely to shed large amounts of the virus. A small number of corvid species (crows, jays, and magpies) have tested positive.

VERGAS AD COUNCIL MINUTES Zoom Meeting April 20, 2022, 3rd Wednesday

Those present: Renee Sonnenberg, Sheri Schoenberger, Jane Wasvick, Carmen Moore, Pastor Amy Strom, and Faye Courneya

Call to order and a devotional by our Chairwoman Renee. P. Amy told of a God intervention in her life in her accidental meeting with another pastor, who gave her resources, advice, guidance, and encouragement, which were the very things she had been praying for.

Pastor Amy re: attendance and activities at our church:

- 1. Attendance at Vergas for Easter Services were disappointing, but the good attendance at the Maundy Thursday Service in Dent had been a nice surprise. She is content with the average attendances at services at both of the churches. The online attendance continues to be consistent and is like a 3rd church she serves.
- 2. Pastor Amy is excited for doing another kayaking program and VBS at Vergas this coming spring/summer.
- 3. She is starting another sermon series about the Lords Prayer, using Adam Hamilton's book.
- 4. She is going to the Covenant Annual Conference next week and a prerecorded service from our conference will be used for the next Sunday service.

Secretary minutes

Approved after a motion to approve from Jane, a second by Faye, and carried.

Treasurer's Report:

Renee moved that the treasurer's report be approved as sent out to us in advance of the meeting, was seconded by Jane, and carried.

Old Business:

\$500 Monthly Mission donations: There has been no further information about the Ukrainian family that Tonya had told us about, so Jane moved that we give the \$300 for local missions to UMCOR for use in with assisting Ukrainian needs, seconded by Sheri, and carried.

Update on Church Audit: One of our Vergas members, Connie Hoffman, has agreed to do an annual audit of our Vergas church books. Since Faye had done a careful review of the last 6 months of Paul's (our previous bookkeeper) books when she took over for him, that will be counted as an audit. Jane moved and Renee seconded that Connie Hoffman be asked to go over Faye's bookkeeping in another year (after the 6 months review of Paul's books) to satisfy the audit requirement on the Methodist Church Form 12. Connie will be paid a courtesy stipend in thanks for her work,

New Business:

<u>CD at Vergas State Bank: (due 4-29):</u> Faye moved that we reinvest the \$50,000 from the CD back at Vergas State Bank, then use the \$251 interest paid out on it to fund the campership program this year; it was seconded by Sheri, and carried. A question was asked if the monies might be needed to help pay for the building re-roofing this year, but we were informed by Faye that we have \$28,000 in a contingency fund and there is also a building maintenance fund that would be used for the roofing.

Handyman needed to do some of the heavy outside work (shrub removal, and replacement of the pipe railing at the back entrance) of the church: Myles Flateland has agreed to do this work for us. Bev Flateland has agreed to help us plan a way to make the church front entrance more beautiful; we may need to hire her to help or find a church member willing to help with the maintenance of any plantings.

Broken Refrigerator: The little refrigerator in the fellowship kitchen has stopped working. Jane moved that we purchase another similar sized one, seconded by Faye, and carried. The men's group will be asked to remove the old one.

<u>VBS</u>: This will be held in Vergas August 1-4. Renee is searching for a program to be used.

<u>Snow removal from the Parking Lot</u> by Carl and Jim Hoffman this winter hasn't been compensated. Jane moved that we pay these two men \$500 for their considerable efforts in clearing all the snow this winter. Seconded by Faye and carried.

Other Business:

Kayaking group was discussed by P. Amy who wants to establish a calendar and planning for the summer get-togethers to be put on our church website so the community will be encouraged to attend. There is a kayaking planning meeting scheduled for next week. Some members, pontoon owners, also want to participate to make the activities more accessible to people who do not kayak. Other activities (ice cream socials, bonfires, walking groups, breakfast clubs, UMW group) were discussed to bring more of our members together in the summer.
