From the Pastor's

ASK THE PASTOR

I will try and let the congregation know a few weeks in advance when we will be doing "Ask the Pastor" so that people can be thinking up questions. It will give people time to email them, text them, or write them out on the Prayer Cards when you get to church that Sunday.



Inspirational Story "Carl - part 1"

Carl was a quiet man. He didn't talk much. He would always greet you with a big smile and a firm handshake. Even after living in our neighborhood for over 50 years, no one could really say they knew him very well.

Before his retirement, he took the bus to work each morning. The lone sight of him walking down the street often worried us. He had a slight limp from a bullet wound received in WWII. Watching him, we worried that although he had survived WWII, he may not make it through our changing uptown neighborhood with its ever - increasing random violence, gangs, and drug activity.

When he saw the flyer at our local church asking for volunteers for caring for the gardens behind the minister's residence, he responded in his characteristically unassuming manner. Without fanfare, he just signed up.

He was well into his 87th year when the very thing we had always feared finally happened. He was just finishing his watering for the day when three gang members approached him. Ignoring their attempt to intimidate him, he simply asked, "Would you like a drink from the hose?"



VERGAS UMC AD COUNCIL MINUTES December 15, 2021

Those present: Renee Sonnenberg, Sheri Schoenberger, Jane Wasvick, Pastor Amy, Margy Nelson, Tanya Johnson, and Faye Courneya

Call to order by our Chairwoman Renee. Renee shared a devotional on fear.

How has God worked in our lives?

Stories were shared

Pastor Amy:

- 1. Pastor Amy also reported that Dent is going to do the Pay it Forward envelopes as well this year. This is positive and Amy is looking forward to the stories after the envelopes are distributed.
- 2. Tanya, Faye, and Sheri are working on the Membership List and how to keep this going. They are using post cards and letters.
- 3. Both churches will have Christmas Eve service with Dent at 3:30 pm and Vergas at 5:00 pm. Amy asked if we have ushers. Connie and Byron Zitzow usually do it and they have agreed to this year. Amy ordered some new candles and also some LED candles to see if we like them for safety. After we see them, this can be discussed.
- 4. This Sunday, the 19th, we are encouraged to wear Christmas outfits, whether they are ugly or not is based in the eyes of the beholder.
- 5. Amy also discussed the Nominating Committee and who would like to continue on the Ad Council committee. Margy would like to be done, as she has been on the committee for over 10 years. Jane, Renee, and Faye will stay on. Tonya will stay but would appreciate someone stepping into the Finance position. If someone would fill that position, she would leave the committee.
- 6. Amy also discussed the difficulty in filling the pulpit when she is on vacation. She thought that she and Jodi and Sheri should not be gone on the same Sundays so there is help for who is filling in. She is using members of the congregation to do the Sundays in January and appreciates the willingness for members to do this. Sheri and Jodi are gone January 9 and 16 and Amy is gone January 23 and 30.

<u>Secretary minutes</u> were approved after a motion to approve from Jane seconded by Margy.

<u>**Treasurer's Report:**</u> Motion to approve by Tonya, seconded by Jane, and approved.

Old Business:

1. The Mission dollars will continue at \$500 per month. In reviewing the past minutes, this should be split with \$300 going to Local missions and \$200 going to the Mission of the Quarter.

- 2. The Missions of the Quarter for 2022 will be: Motion by Renee, seconded by Faye and approved.
 - a. Jan, Feb, Mar will be the Food Shelves
 - b. Apr, May, June will be Relay for Life
 - c. July, Aug, Sept will be Samaritan's Purse
 - d. Oct, Nov, Dec will be Salvation Army
- 3. It was discussed that we should see if there was a church in the path of the tornados that we could assist. Amy will check on this and we will decide what to do at the January meeting.
- 4. Faye will go ahead and order the Lending Library, will need to find someone to put it together and paint it. There will be a need to check on this to make sure that it doesn't get too junky.

New Business:

- 1. Margy discussed the need to access the basement especially for Sunday school and special functions. Connie Prunty offered to be part of installing a chair lift at the church. She just had one installed at her home and would use the same company at the church. The committee would like to get the company in and get an estimate, then discuss it further with Connie and proceed. Fay mentioned that we have \$1688 in the memorial fund that could be used.
- 2. Sheri discussed how to do the Liturgist and Ushers for the next year. We had difficulty getting volunteers, so we made assignments. This did not work as well as expected so we will go back to volunteers and see how it goes. Sheri will watch for openings and put in the bulletin.
- 3. There was discussion on what to do when church is cancelled. There should be something online to substitute for church. This could be a devotional or prerecorded program. Amy will think about this, and we will discuss in January.
- 4. The Committee decided that the meetings in Jan, Feb. March will be by Zoom due to the weather and driving.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
