Trying Out a Texting Prayer Chain in Vergas



You probably already received a text on Florene Zitzow's passing and funeral details. And a prayer request for Frank Noyes.

Utilizing a phone calling Prayer Chain is a fairly labor - intensive process. Sondra Flett has done such a great job, faithfully handling this for years in Vergas. But she was also getting a bit tired of managing it. We are so grateful for her years of service! This is a welcome change.

Our Prayer Chain in both Dent and Vergas has not only been used to send on prayer requests but also to notify the church family when someone has passed/funeral details, but also to communicate bad weather/church cancellations and also when there is an important event in the life of the church. We feel creating a Texting Prayer Chain is critical to good communication as we move forward.

There is no denying crafting and sending a text is much quicker and easier than calling. But the downside... texting requires someone who is more comfortable with utilizing the technological end of things. Therefore, Sheri Schoenberger will handle the Texting Prayer Chain in Vergas.

Mission of the Quarter for Vergas & Dent



The Mission of the Quarter is **The Salvation Army**.

How did the Salvation Army start? Born in 1829 in Nottingham, UK, William Booth found his Christian faith early on in life and became an active Methodist, preaching and helping the poor in his local area. After some time working as a pawnbroker, he moved with his wife Catherine Mumford to the

east of London. The two of them began working with a group of Christian businessmen who were concerned for the poor and disadvantaged in their community. In June 1865, William Booth preached to crowds outside the Blind Beggar pub; a new organization, The Christian Mission, was born.

Over the next few years, the movement flourished. Its focus on teaching people about the message of Jesus in a way they could relate to, meeting wherever they could – dance halls, bowling alleys and outdoors – as well as addressing some of their material needs, saw many people become Christians. Despite opposition from parts of the public who disliked some of the Booths' methods and style, many joined.

Their focus on those who had been rejected by the traditional churches was key. All were welcome – including those impoverished and disadvantaged.




