As we begin a new year, we also begin a new sermon series called RESET (a resource from Greater New Jersey). I am excited about this one personally. But I also think this is right for us in both of our churches.

As God would have it, we are building NEW Ad Councils in BOTH Dent and in Vergas. Exciting times! And we have an opportunity like never before to dream and discuss what we would like our futures to look like as this new year unfolds.

For the sermon series, we will emphasize in RESET how God's mercies are new every morning (Luke 3:22-23)! But sometimes it is just so easy for us to get stuck in the same old routines. I like my routines and so do my cats. But how do we make sure we are staying open to the life God wants to lead us into and bless us with? Sometimes we must RESET.

This year let's hit the "reset button" so we can claim the fresh start God makes available to us. Let us focus on resetting our souls on God, resetting our purpose on God's Kingdom priorities, resetting on our shared values of our faith and expectations and resetting our direction as into the good things God is unfolding a church.

You might be surprised to hear I am suggesting small adjustments, just tiny tweaks, only slight shifts in attitude and in how we work together. Because I believe SMALL changes can add up over time to make a BIG difference.

For instance, I keep thinking about the back left tire on my dad's van. It typically runs low when winter hits, but only by maybe 4 or 5 PSI. When that happens, I don't put 100 pounds of air in the tire, or 30 or even 10 pounds of pressure in that tire. NO WAY! No, I only add the 4 PSI needed to bring it back up to match the rest of the tires and get things running smoothly again. Only that. We want to add just enough change to get things running smoothly again. And part of that includes looking for everyone to help make these small adjustments, for each of us to do our part. For each of us to contribute to the whole, of helping our churches flourish again. We need to pull together. I just love what the Bishop said when we listened to her interview a while ago..."We all do better when we all do better."

Our new sermon series begins Sunday, January 8th and will be for all of January. This would be a good time to invite someone you haven't seen in church for a while. Let them know you have been thinking of them, you miss them, and that we are starting a new sermon series. It's an easy excuse for ALL of us to jump back before us!

Week 1: Soul Reset | Luke 3:21-23

Resetting your soul begins with remembering who you are. In baptism, God calls us beloved.

Week 2: Reset Purpose | Mark 1:32-39

Spending time with God enables us to start our year with intention. Centered living comes from understanding God's purpose in this season.

Week 3: Reset Values | Galatians 5:24-6:10

What does it mean to live by God's Spirit and not our own, to live according to God's values and not those of the world?

Week 4: Reset Direction | Acts 9:1-15

Whether we've been in the church for a long time or are exploring the faith, Jesus sometimes calls us to move in a new direction, even when we think we are already heading in the right direction.

The Ad Council has decided to do our mission offerings for 3 months at a time. The schedule will be:











The Church Ladies
