A dedication for the new Veterans Memorial Park in Vergas was held on Saturday, June 11, 2022.

The Vergas Memorial Park Committee spent several months researching veterans memorials, to see what worked in other communities and to ensure their project was

unique.




The final design includes two cement circles — one with a star in the middle and the other with a smaller circle. Flagpoles were installed to display the flags for each branch of the military, as well as the U.S. flag. Benches, memorial pillars and more are also part of the memorial. Each year, churches in the Minnesota Annual Conference take a Love Offering for missions in conjunction with



VERGAS AD COUNCIL MINUTES

June 15, 2022, 3rd Wednesday

Those present: Renee Sonnenberg, Sheri Schoenberger, Jane Wasvick, Tonya Johnson, and Faye Courneya

Call to order by our Chairperson Renee

Attendance Report was given by Sheri and is increasing some. The in person attendance is passing the online as some of the summer members are back. Giving has evened out and budget is on track.

Secretary minutes Approved after a motion to approve from Tonya, a second by Sheri, and carried.

Treasurer's Report: Tonya moved that the treasurer's report be approved, was seconded by Sheri, and carried.

Business:

\$500 Monthly Mission donations: Jane made a motion to use the \$300 from May and the \$300 from June and add it to our Love offering to send to the Bishop, seconded by Faye and approved.

Filling the Pulpit: There was discussion about what happens when Amy is ill or on vacation. When Amy is ill, the Council felt that if sermons were available any one of us could lead the service. Sheri has previous services, so the Council member available will get one from Sheri and use it for service. If Amy is using a planned vacation, the preference would be to use another pastor and the Council agreed with paying this person \$250.

Little Library: The Little Library is installed. There was concern that we need a more substantial post which the Men's Club will work on. General consensus that the library should be inside during the winter months.

Update on Shrubs: Rick will talk with one of the Hoffman's and see if they can get a backhoe to remove the shrubs. No further information available.

Shingling and Outdoor View: Renee met with Summers about shingling the roof and discussed getting an estimate on the handicap access and rail in back to see alternatives. Renee also showed him the window that concerned us. Summers is very busy but will try to get the roof shingled this summer-fall and get us an estimate on the other issues.

Bat Issue: Renee has not had any communication from Raleigh and a bill has not arrived so unsure if this has been completed yet.

Other Business:

Faye mentioned that she will contact the person that sprays for bugs in the area and have the outside sprayed.

Faye brought up that when a member dies and the family gives a donation to the church that a thank you should be written to the family. The Dahlgren's have given \$3000 to the church. Jane will write a note when Faye receives the money. It was decided that this money will be used for the outdoor improvements. We should also recognize the donation with signage.

Renee brought up the Active Shooter Issue as there was discussion in Dent wondering if we should have a plan. Renee will explore what is available for education. We also discussed first aid available and whether there should be an AED in the church. Tonya will explore if there are grants available for any of these issues as well as handicapped access.

Jane reported that Connie Prunty is still waiting for additional information on the stairway lift and will let us know as soon as that is available.
