Mission of the Quarter



The Mission for this quarter will be Samaritan's Purse which funds Operation Christmas Child. Mission dollars collected during this quarter (July, August, and September) will be added to the budgeted dollars to fund this outreach.

Long before shoeboxes arrive in more than 100 countries, volunteer National Leadership Teams train pastors and community leaders who want to share the Gospel message and bless children. The leaders learn how to host child-friendly outreach events, and how to implement The Greatest Journey follow-up discipleship program.

Pastors around the world host outreach events in places where people may not know Christ and invite them to follow Him. Other churches use the boxes as resources for outreach in orphanages and other at-risk areas. Boys and girls grow in Christ and share with friends and family. The students also invite others to their graduations where the Gospel is shared. This often brings parents, siblings, and friends to accept Christ and become active members in the local church. Families are reached, churches grow, new churches are started, and communities are transformed.

Samaritan's Purse also funds a large disaster response within the United States as well as internationally. They set up and staffed a field hospital in New York City during the pandemic.



Vergas meets at the Loon's Nest at 9am on the last Friday of the month.








No one is too young or too old to join the Church Ladies. So

Ad Council Minutes July 20, 2022

Those present: Pastor Amy, Sheri Schoenberger, Renee Sonnenberg, Jane Wasvick, Carmen Moore

Pastor Amy's Updates:

- She is reviewing the attendance to church services over the last three years, although Sheri sees no large changes in attendance this year.
- She has created a "Pulpit Fill" Document for the times she may be absent and is sending it to the SPPRC Char for their potential use.
- She is rescheduling the SPPRC committee meeting for Aug 21, so there will be no conflict with the VBS Meetings.
- A call from the Bridge Pantry was received, and is there anyone in our congregation directly involved with the Bridge? Jane tells us the there need to be a cessation of food drop offs at the church; no one is responsible to deliver it. Sheri will put it in the newsletter that we will no longer take donations of food at church, only monies to give to the food pantries.
- P. Amy has had to buy a new computer; Jane moved that we share the cost of the new computer with Dent. Motion seconded and carried.
- Dent has requested to have a team of 10 people for "Feeding My Starving Children" organization. Will Vergas complete the team?
- Will the raffle sponsored by the women's group need a license? Jane looked into it and learned that MN law does not require a license for non-profit raffles if the prize is worth less than \$1500 and the raffle profits do no exceed \$2500 for the year, so the quilt raffle is exempt from the need of a license.
- Dent is having a non-bread communion; it might be good to offer GF wafers for the Vergas communion too.
- An update on Kayaking: 4 more host families have come forward this year over; last summer and 2 new people have responded to our posters for Kayaking this year. P. Amy sees the need to make our church more easily accessible through activities that attract new people to join us, as kayaking and bonfires have done.
- VBS has posters up in several of the surrounding communities, there may be 8-12 children interested in attending, and she sees more interest building in the congregations for VBS.Prayers were requested from the AD Council to help the meaning of the "Summer of Love" theme (this August) take hold for our congregation. She wants the language of love to be better known to us for use with friends, church family, spouses, etc. to help us communicate love more readily.
- We will have a birthday fellowship on the last Sunday of each month at our churches

Secretary Report: Approved as sent out. **Treasurers Report**: Approved as given out.

Missions: There were no suggestions of needs that are being experienced by families in our community. Jane moved that we hold the allocated monies for missions until needs for them arise; motion carried.

Color Copies:

Faye reported that for 6 months our overages for copies has cost \$292.37. We will continue to split the cost with Dent and will see what the overages for the year will be so we can adjust our contract for copies accordingly.

Worker Comp. Insurance Costs: These should be shared by both churches; Faye and Ivy will communicate about their payment of the premiums so we can split the costs between the two churches.

Church Landscaping: The men's group pulled out the overgrown shrubs in front of the church entrance and has recommended that we wait till next spring to replant those places.

Update on Church Roof and improvements Needed:

Renee has talked to Mike Summers re: roofing the church and the back entry improvements; Mr. Summers cannot get to it this summer but will put us at the top of his work list for next year. Renee is going to get his estimates for the work to be done.

Insects and Bats: the church has been sprayed for insects and the bats have been removed.

Active Shooter Scenario:

Renee will work on this issue and how we will address it after VBS.

New Business:

Parsonage: Jane received a phone call from the Frazee Methodist Church, and they would like to schedule a walk-thru of the parsonage to see if they should plan for repairs or updates that it may need. There is a probability that the parsonage rent will be increased.

Purchase of a Leaf Blower:

Faye would like for us to purchase a leaf blower for the church grounds; Keith Sandou will volunteer to keep the entrances cleaned with it. Jane moved that we purchase a leaf blower, motion carried.

Next Meeting is Aug 17th.
